Minutes of the Public Hearing held on February 16, 2021 at 7:02 p.m. regarding Conditional Use C2-21; an application from Raeanna Hiebert for the renewal of authorization for a home-based massage therapy business on Lot 16, Block 8, Plan 19956, civically known as 33 2nd Street South, previously granted approval under Conditional Use C2-19. The proposal was duly advertised as per Section 169 of *The Planning Act*. Mayor Myron Dyck served as chairperson, with all members of Council in attendance.

Eric King, CAO of the Town of Niverville noted that this was a renewal of authorization for a home-based massage therapy business at 33 2nd Street South, originally granted approval under Conditional Use C2-19. The original application for home-based massage therapy business was approved in 2019. There was one objection to the proposal at that time regarding space and parking. Since the business has been in operation, there has been no further opposition received nor any complaints received.

Ms. Raeanna Hiebert (applicant) had no questions to add.

Mr. King noted there was no opposition received to the proposal.

Councillor Stott asked whether the business had increased, whether she has joined the Chamber of Commerce and whether she was considering a move to Main Street.

Ms. Hiebert noted that the business had increased, she had not joined the Chamber and was not considering a move to Main Street.

Councillor Dueck thanked the applicant for going through the proper process to receive Conditional Use approval for running her business.
