

RECREATION FACILITY COVID REQUIREMENTS

Please note, rules and regulations are continuously changing as information is released by the Province of Manitoba. To ensure you are complying with the latest requirements, we recommend visiting this page prior to arriving at our facility.

Mask Use

Masks are required in all Town Recreational Facilities, unless participating in physical activity. There are times when a mask can be temporarily removed:

- Receiving a service that requires the removal of their mask
- Consuming food or drink
- Emergency medical purposes
- Establishing their identity

Niverville Community Resource and Recreation Centre

Entry through center doors (labelled entrance only) and provide appropriate documentation to staff. Dressing rooms will be available 20 minutes prior for practices, and 30 minutes for games, unless otherwise stated.

Exit through doors to the West of the main doors by the playground (labelled exit only).

Capacity is 250 spectators, which does not include people actively participating in sport or team and game day staff. The full facility is included in the capacity limit and, the Recreation Department will inform user groups of potential issues.

Niverville Centennial Arena

Enter through East doors (labelled entrance only) and provide appropriate documentation to staff. Dressing rooms will be available 20 minutes prior for practices, and 30 minutes for games, unless otherwise stated. Spectators may be required to wait until previous ice time spectators leave before entrance is allowed.

Exit through doors on the West side (labelled exit only). Spectators are asked to please leave the building after the ice time to allow new spectators into the building.

Capacity is 50 spectators, which does not include people actively participating in sport or team and game day staff.
