## Notice of Public Hearing

REGARDING SPECIAL SERVICE PLAN 20

Re: Garbage Collection, Transportation and Disposal Service Levy

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to subsection 318(1) of The Municipal Act that the Council of the Town of Niverville has scheduled a public meeting:

If you would like to attend but do not have electronic means or internet access, please call the office 204-388-4600 and staff will make alternate arrangements.

Council will hear any person who wishes to make a representation, ask questions, or register an objection to the following Special Service Proposal:

Council is proposing to continue to provide the collection, transportation and disposal of household waste services within the Town of Niverville. A Special Service levy based on an amount per residential dwelling unit per parcel of land (assessment roll) will be levied on all single residential dwelling units, duplexes (2 residential dwelling units), and multiple residential dwellings of three apartment units or less within the Town of Niverville to raise an amount sufficient to offset the cost of the service to be provided. The service will not include any manufacturing, vacant residential lots, institutions, or apartment units containing 4 residential dwelling units or greater. The new Special Service by-law will be in place for 10 years (2021 to 2030 inclusive).

The 2020 cost of providing the service to each unit (one residential dwelling unit) was \$123.28 broken down as follows:

- i. Waste Disposal Fee \$56.35 per parcel (single residential dwelling unit)
- ii. Garbage Collection & Transportation \$66.93 per parcel (single residential dwelling unit)

Total cost of providing garbage collection, transportation, and waste disposal services in 2020 was approximately \$191,450.00.

The total estimated costs for the years 2021 to 2030 are:

Minimum (2021) - \$194,125 to Maximum (2030) - \$360,600

The estimated costs per residential dwelling unit for the years 2021 to 2030 are:

Minimum (2021) - \$125.00 to Maximum (2030) - \$200.00

Residential properties with multiple dwelling units will be levied based on the number of residential dwelling units in each parcel.

The CAO will receive objections, support or comments about the proposal by email or letter for individuals that cannot or prefer not to attend the virtual meeting. **Please provide your correspondence by 12:00 p.m. on January 18, 2021 to [planning@whereyoubelong.ca](mailto:planning@whereyoubelong.ca).** This correspondence will be presented to Council and recorded in the minutes of the Public Hearing. Anonymous comments will not be addressed.
