NIVERVILLE PLANS FOR A GROWING FUTURE

As Manitoba's fastest growing community, the Town of Niverville is always planning for the future. The Town, working with community planning consultants Urban Systems, has recently commissioned a Sustainable Growth Strategy which projects that the Town will absorb all available vacant residential land within 15 to 20 years. As a result, the Town recently submitted a proposal to the Manitoba Municipal Board to transfer lands from the Rural Municipality of Hanover to the Town of Niverville. This process is generally known as annexation. The proposal was submitted with the support of the Rural Municipality of Hanover.

Although 20 years may seem like a long time, it is important to plan proactively for the future to ensure sustainable growth for Niverville. Transferring lands now to Niverville will ensure that they do not become fragmented or developed with incompatible uses, and more difficult to transfer or develop in the future. Expanding Niverville's municipal boundaries will provide additional certainty for everyone in the whole region.

Generally speaking, Niverville intends to grow to the east, along Highway 311 and towards Highway 59, away from
