

Notice of Bylaw No. 849-23 Frozen Waterways Regulation

Please be advised that the Town of Niverville passed Bylaw 849-23 on February 21, 2023, which regulates activities on the frozen surfaces of waterways within the Town. The following points are outlined in the Bylaw, and may be viewed in full at www.whereyoubelong.ca under the Bylaws, Policies, and Reports tab.

- 1. Designated employees may prohibit activities on waterways if deemed unsafe, etc.
- 2. Certain activities on frozen waterways will now require a permit to be issued, with conditions in place (please see full Bylaw for details)
- Any person who places or installs an object on a frozen waterway must ensure that it is removed annually by March 1st, starting March 1, 2023.

Annual Public Notice

Additions to the Voters List and/or Personal Security Protection Requests

In accordance with Section 36 of The Municipal Councils and School Board Elections Act (MCSBEA), the Town of Niverville Voters List is open for changes or revisions.

- Any person who is eligible to vote in municipal elections in the Local Authority of the Town of Niverville can have his or her name added to the Voters List, or have any information about the voter in the Voters List corrected.
- Any person can request to have his or her name and address obscured from the Voters List.

A person whose name has been obscured will receive a Personal Security Certificate and identification number. In a vote on a question, that person may only vote by Sealed Envelope Ballot and cannot vote in person at the regular or advance voting places.

To implement the above, a written request including name and address along with proof of identity must be submitted to the Senior Election Official in person, by e-mail, fax or mail to:

Did You Know?

The Town's **Traffic and Parking Bylaw 801-18** regulates things like:

<u>Section 3.2</u>: No person shall park a vehicle on a street in such a manner that it obstructs the entrance to a lane or to a driveway or an approach leading to a private premise or public pathway.

And

<u>Section 3.7</u>: No person shall park a vehicle on a street for fourteen (14) consecutive hours or more, within the Town of Niverville.

Sewer Back Up Reminder

Experiencing a sewer back up issue? Before you incur any costs by calling a private sewer cleaning company, please contact the Town first. Town staff will then check the sewer main to determine if that is where the problem lies.

After hours contact the Operations Department by dialing the emergency line at 204-388-4600 ext. 1111 and leave a message including call back telephone number. Within a reasonable time frame, a staff member will call you back. The full Sewer and Water Service Connection Repair Policy may be viewed on the Town website at www.whereyoubelong.ca under the Bylaws, Policies & Reports tab.
